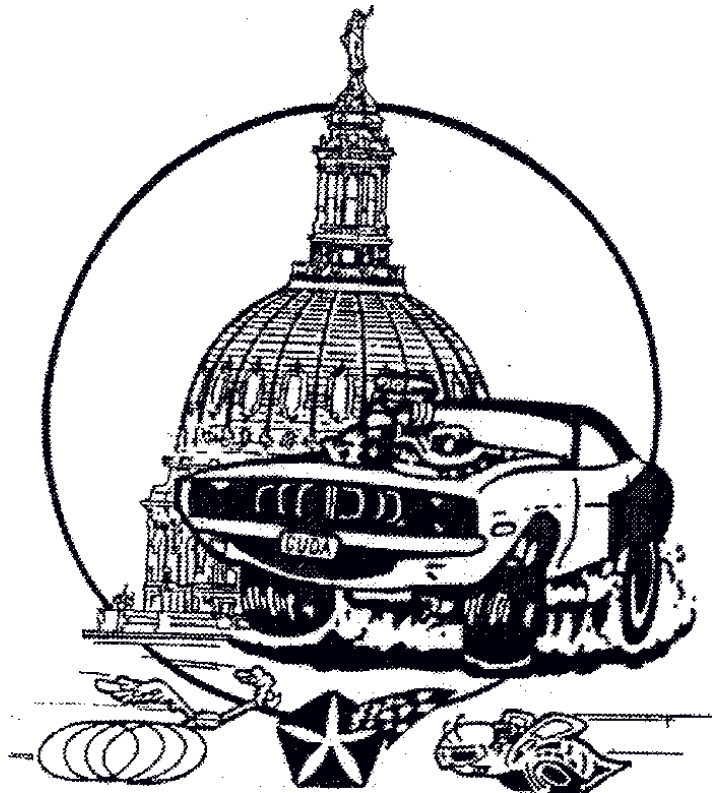

those who have never attended a Nationals before. I could write a book on why I think everyone should experience the Nats at least once, but I will try to keep it short. I think this will be my 8th Nats trip, having made all 5 years at Indy and the last 2 at Columbus. First is the size of the event, it's probably the largest ALL MOPAR event many of you will ever attend. The swap meet is high on my list of favorites; you don't have to sort through row after row of brand X parts to see a few Mopar sprinklings. The stuff you read about in the magazines, the rare hard to find, very few made, all were recalled, none survived stuff, you will find at the Nats, and plenty of everything else. The only thing not there of course is my 67 radiator! Prices range from absolute ridiculous to bargains. The show car field is stunning and educational. I have never been an advocate of trailer queens and 100% resto's, but what you can learn from these cars is invaluable! A still or video camera is an absolute must for documentation purposes. If you have ever wondered what your Mopar looked like a different color, or with different options, you can see it at the Nats! There is bracket drag racing for those with the racing bug, and always the much anticipated burnout contest. There are usually celebrities from the Mopar Racing community in attendance, and all the top Mopar part supplier companies have a special section reserved to sell parts.

I have always tried to help keep the cost of the trip as low as possible, being personally involved in setting up every trip for the club. We use services such as Lowestfare.com to purchase the most reasonable airfare and rental vehicle. The Twins have helped in room accommodations, reserving double rooms for under \$50 a night. Jerry Pennington has been known to drive the trip, offering an extra empty seat a time or 2. He has also brought one or two parts back for the group. I usually go up a day early and drive over to Dayton Ohio, spending a day at the U.S. Air Force Museum. The museum is free, and houses some EXTREMELY rare aircraft. Last year I even included a side trip to visit my friend and NHRA Pro Stock driver Roger Jenkins' shop. Every year has produced a very enjoyable and profitable trip to all that participated, always with SOMETHING unexpectedly happening to add to the many told stories. If you have not gone, you simply do not know what you are missing! After the first time, it will not be your last! If I have been successful in tweaking your interest in going, please contact me to reserve your place. Let's make the 2001 trip the largest ever.

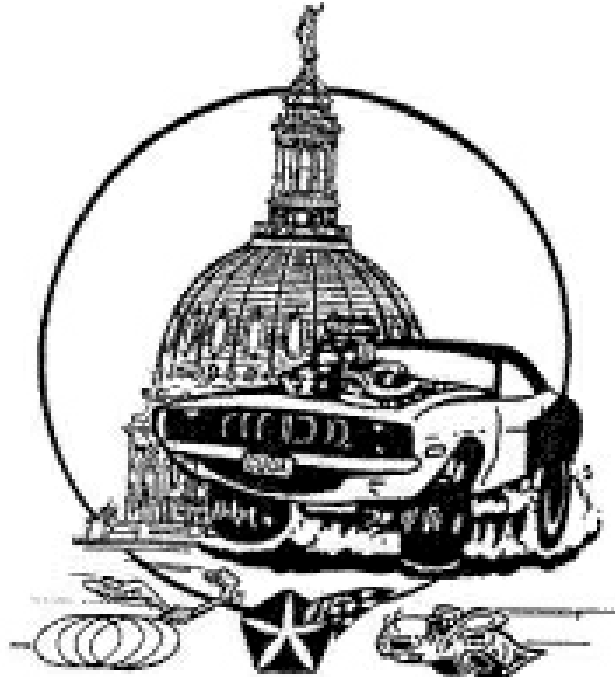
